# WHAT ARE SAFE HAVENS?

 A Safe Haven site provides an alternative to abandonment, abuse or murder of a newborn.

 Public safety and emergency departments are designated Safe Havens.

# WHERE ARE SAFE HAVENS?

 MISSOURI: A newborn may be left in the hands of staff at <u>hospitals</u>, <u>ambulance</u>, <u>police or fire</u>
 Safe Place for Newborns Act 2002

 KANSAS: A newborn may be left in the hands of any staff on duty at <u>hospitals</u>, <u>fire stations</u>, <u>city</u> and county health departments.

### WHO NEEDS TO KNOW ABOUT SAFE HAVEN?

There is very little data but what we have indicates primarily women between 18 to 22 years old of all education levels, ethnic backgrounds and income levels who:

- Likely have had no prenatal care;
- Are unmarried/not in a relationship with the father of the baby;
- Feel isolated and alone;
- Have feelings of guilt and shame about their pregnancy that factor into their decision to abandon their baby;
- Their newborn may be the product of incest or rape;
- See abandonment as part of the pregnancy denial and as a way to achieve ultimate closure to a traumatic event.

## WHY IS THERE A NEED FOR THIS LAW?

Four children die every day in the United States as a result of child abuse.


Three out of four of these victims are under the age of 4.
