Priority	Votes
Special needs - children & youth with special needs have limited services & providers.	7
Single access point for housing, child care, health, mental health, food pantry, medical card, food stamps, dentists - smaller communities - at least a resource list or access info in each community - how to access these social & health services? - able to access info in smaller community, maybe without having to ask someone in your community directly	7
Access to medical services in the rural areas - medical - health department - pharmacy <span style="font-size: 2em; vertical-align: middle;">}</span> <span style="display: inline-block; vertical-align: middle;">NO or limited services need in the community</span>	7
<u>Mental health</u> throughout the county is a need - especially specialized areas, e.g. no one in Manhattan specializes in <u>autism spectrum</u> - Military Mental Health Services	7
Lack of child care in rural areas; no after school care	6
Transportation - especially if no clinics or health/social services here, need transportation to get to services	5
Affordable & quality housing - throughout county - senior housing, especially outside of Manhattan - family & senior housing - rentals	4
